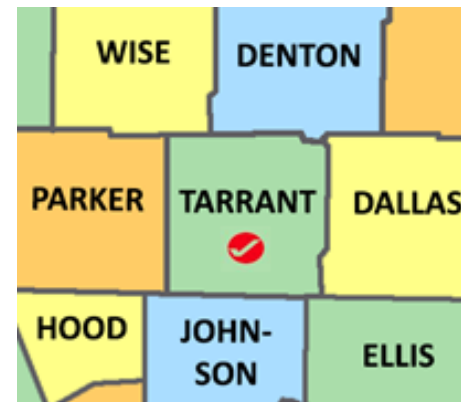
No copies (including published or copyrighted photos), only art created within the last 2 years, digital and computer generated artwork will not be accepted.
